1. Title:-

The role of Gymkhana in personality development of the players.

2. Goals:-

- To create physically well-built, energetic and efficient citizens for the society.
- To develop sportsmanship and democratic spirit and democratic behaviour among the students.
- To imbibe the life values like co-operation, healthy competition and result oriented effort amongst the youths.
- To equip the students with the qualities like endurance and patience
- To create social culture, the virtues like self esteem and patriotic feelings.
- To prepare deserving students for employment, uniform services and for further careers.

3. Context:-

It is the experience that most of the players come to the college are from economically poor families. The sports department in the college provides financial aids to the needy students. The students participating in sports at State and National level are helped by providing them travel,

lodging, boarding expenses.

The college has a large and enough play ground with 400 m running track for the players. The college ground is unique in three tahasils- Gadhinglaj, Ajara and Chandgad. As a result, student players prefer our college for their admission. We respond the students positively in giving admission in various classes.

4. Practice:-

Once the college admissions are over, the physical director and a few senior players call all the players on the ground for selecting their events. Their ability in various sports and games is identified and practice is given accordingly.

When the students are free from their periods, they are trained and motivated for rigorous practice. The college organizes competitions among the players themselves. This process helps the college in selecting better, genuine players.

The training in the gymkhana and practice on the ground are combined and the result is that college has won university general championship. The activity helped the students to develop their personality.

Enough financial help is given to the economically backward players. In addition, the professors like Shri.S.G.Munj, provides personal assistance for diet, sportswear and bus passes etc. The college gives them relaxation in exam fees and admission fees. The college provides shoes, kits, spikes and other sport materials at free of charge to the students. The college does have some players that have participated at international level.

All the sports activities are run under able guidance of the Physical Director, Shri.R.D. Magdum.

5. Evidence of Success:-

The College has established a very rich tradition in the field of sports and games, particularly in athletics. For the last two years, college has won General Championship in athletics at the University level. Our lady athlete team has retained zonal athletic championship successively for two years.

For the last three years, continuously our girls have won ladies Cross-country general championship at university level. These activities have helped in developing their personality which is reflected in their achievements and getting employment.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:-

The problems faced and solutions worked out:

- Financial problems for player as they come from poor families.
- Event wise experts are not available due to our college in remote area. We cannot make the experts available easily.
- Experts like sports counsellor - Specialists in sports physiology, sports psychology are not easily available.
- During college hours sufficient practice and training cannot be given to the players. We cannot call them after office hours or in the evening because the students coming here are from far- off- places. To compensate this, during competition period extensive training is given.
- For indoor games we do not have ample space in the existing gym. To overcome the problem a new multipurpose sports complex is under construction.
- Accommodation, particularly for girls, is not available in the premise. Therefore the girls are unable to make sufficient practice. The college ladies hostel is under construction and is in the completion stage. This would be a good solution to overcome the problem cited above.
